1. PRINCIPLES  
OF  
TRAINING.

Only by a conception of the Unit as a whole in all its phases can the Training be framed on sound progressive lines giving the due proportion of time to each rank in the unit.

2. CLASSES.

To achieve the maximum results from the limited period of training the following classes will be run.

i. Brigade Classes.

- a. Officers for promotion.
- b. W. and N.C.O's for First Appointment to Commsd. rank.
- c. N.C.O's for promotion.
- d. Gunners for first appointment to Non Commissioned rank.

The above classes will be run on every Monday night less the last Monday in each month and all Officers, N.C.O's and aspiring N.C.O's must attend.

On the last Monday night in each month the Battery Commanders will run a Battery Class night for their Unit personnel.

ii. Battery Voluntary Parades.

On a night other than Monday night, Batteries will run a monthly voluntary parade as under:-

- 25th Battery.....2nd week in each month.
- 27th Battery.....3rd week in each month.
- 107th Battery.....4th week in each month.

iii. Signal Classes.

On Monday nights other than Battery Monday nights there will be a Brigade Signallers Class, under one of the N.C.O's i/c Sigs.

iv. Classes will commence as under:-

a. Brigade Classes.

3. BATTERY  
TRAINING.

This class is only to obtain a ground work of personnel with Lewis Gun training.
